From the data collected we have noted that the centre roll has remained steady, the centre can accommodate 24 0-2's, 20 2-3's and 54 3-5's. 17 children live between deciles 1,2,3 with the higher percentage of our children living in deciles 4 & 8. We currently have no care experienced children in our care. Attendance in the last term has remained steady averaging 91% We have noted an increase in our achievement of milestones, we can only presume this is due to having a higher number of pre-schoolers this year, year around these drop with more ante pre children being accommodated, this is above the local authority percentage. Milestones identified for improvement are like that of the local authority.
